<u>Project Summary</u>: Provide (<u>attachment</u> in Word format, not to exceed 3 pages) a description of your research project proposal. Include background based on literature review, importance and rationale of project. Describe methodology, human subjects' protocol (if relevant), methods of data collection and analysis, and <u>your role in the project</u>. Specify if the project has already been formulated and activated by the international site P.I., or if the project is one of your own design. Note if a foreign institutional IRB approval has been obtained.

<u>Timetable and Outcomes</u>: Specify an approximate timetable for your participation in the project with goals and benchmarks. If you plan to complete data collection during your 2 month elective, indicate a timetable for data analysis. If the project will not be substantially completed during your elective, indicate if you will participate in interim data analysis or will continue with the project until completion. Note if you plan to develop a publishable abstract or paper based on this work, and give a timetable for completion of the abstract/article.

<u>Budget</u>: Provide a budget that accounts for approximate costs of round trip economy airfare, insurances and immunizations, and includes the \$30/day living allowance, with a maximum of 60 days/\$1800 per diem allowance. Maximum total budget is \$3000. Expectation is that the project will require an 8 week commitment, give or take 2-3 days.

Extramural Funding: Please list any other sources of funding that you have applied for to support this activity. If you have received an award please attach the budget details. In general, extramural awards reimburse eligible expenses before intramural funds may be utilized.
