GRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Undergraduate degree from an accredited institution with an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Official transcript(s) from all higher education institutions attended
- Minimum of 12 credits in prerequisite courses or equivalent (Phonetics, Anatomy and Physiology of the Speech and Hearing Mechanism, Typical Speech and Language Development, and Speech Science)
- Two letters of recommendation, resume, and admission essay
- Demonstrate personal and/or professional experience through research, clinical work, teaching, leadership, or community involvement
- If eligible, complete a successful interview with the admissions committee

Students who are not Communication Sciences and Disorders/Speech-Language Pathology majors must take prerequisite courses including language development, anatomy and physiology of speech, phonetics, and speech science.
