Read this before registering for an online winter course:

Please be aware that each course is three credits. We are required to meet the same learning objectives and goals in a winter course as we would in a spring or fall course which meets for 15 weeks. For each 3 credit course, you are required to have 45 hours of class time. For an online course, this class time is most often referred to as “discussion board”. In addition to class time, students need to schedule time for reading, writing, homework assignments, research, etc. Just because this is a winter course which runs for 11 days does not mean there is less work than a course that runs for 15 weeks.

Before registering for a winter course, consider your schedule. If you feel you may have trouble with the intensity of a winter course, you may want to reconsider taking a course during winter session.

HAS 544 Principles of Managed Care

This course provides an in-depth understanding of the meaning of managed care in the context of the United States health care system. The course will also review the history, components, and various organizational forms of managed care systems. Potential benefits, inherent limitations, and the legal, social, and ethical implications of managed care as a health care delivery system will be discussed. HAS 544 is an **ELECTIVE** course for students enrolled in either of these Master of Science concentrations: **Health Care Management and Health Policy**. For students in the Advanced Certificate in Health Care Management, HAS 544 counts toward the certificate.

HAS 579 Advanced Seminar in Health Policy (Persuasion and Communication)

This seminar is designed to provide students with an in-depth analysis of the principle of health policy-making. Examples from local and national policies are used as a framework for the student to develop an appreciation of the dynamics and complexities of policy making. Furthermore, it is expected that students will be able to synthesize the information gained throughout the course in order to demonstrate competencies in policy composition and dissemination. HAS 579 is an **ELECTIVE** course for students enrolled in either of these Master of Science concentrations: **Health Care Management and Health Policy**. For students in the Advanced Certificate in Health Care Management, HAS 579 counts toward the certificate.
